THE CARVING OF STONE MOUNTAIN

Stone Mountain is the largest exposed granite face in the world.

We all know and understand that Stone Mountain is a museum, telling the story of the Civil War. We know that the three soldiers carved into the mountain are President Jefferson Davis, General Robert E. Lee, and General Thomas J. "Stonewall" Jackson.

But, do you know how the carving came to life? Blasting, of course! Well, sort of.

The United Daughters of the Confederacy contacted the famous sculptor, Gutzon Borglum, (sculptor of Mount Rushmore) to sculpt a likeness of General Robert E. Lee on the mountain. Borglum refused and suggested a much larger sculpture that would include Lee, with a column of Confederate Soldiers.

Work began on the mountain in 1923. Steel beams were installed on the face of the mountain that would support the work platforms for the remainder of the project. The workers blasted using dynamite, and carving with jackhammers. On January 19, 1924 the Lee sculpture was unveiled to thousands of spectators.

The next step was to carve General "Stonewall" Jackson on the mountain. The relationship between Borglum and his patrons went sour. Accusations of financial misconduct escalated. Borglum eventually fled the state of Georgia, to avoid being arrested.

Augustus Lukeman succeeded Borglum on the project. He put his carving just below where Borglum had begun his. Later on, the work of Borglum was blasted off. Lukeman had completed two human heads and one horse's head when the original contract expired in 1928. The project was out of money and the Great Depression ensued.

In 1958, the State of Georgia purchased Stone Mountain. In 1963, Walker Kirtland Hancock was retained to oversee the completion of the artwork. Once again, men scaled the half-completed mountain to prepare for carving. Workers began highlighting the existing portraits of Lee and Jackson by using new thermo-jet torches. They did this to remove an ugly coating of mildew that had accumulated, and to give the carving a uniform surface. Carvers quickly discovered that the intense heat of the torches created a glassy look and the workers were able to remove tons of stone in one day, by using the thermo-jet torches.

On May 9, 1970, the carving of Stone Mountain was officially dedicated. Vice President Agnew was in attendance. William Holmes Borders, a noted African-American theologian and pastor of the Wheat St. Baptist Church, gave the invocation. In 1972, the carving was officially declared complete.
